We are approximately about 30 votes short. If you have not filled out your form there is one online or please contact the board and we will personally send one out to you. Hoping to be 100% by the end of the month,

We want to thank everyone for their patience with the transition of our Davis Spring website. Frank Maulit, a Davis Spring homeowner, has taken on the role of Webmaster and is now the Website Committee Chairperson. He has done an incredible job working on updating the information for the site to run smoothly. This a long process so we ask for your patience until completed.

There have been recent reports of street lights that are not working and questions over whom to contact to have them replaced. The city is responsible for coming out and replacing the lights. If you live on the north side of Neenah you will contact Pedernales Electric and on the south side you will contact the City of Austin. I hope that this clears up any confusion in the future.

The well has proven to be a good investment for the neighborhood. During the first 12 months of operation we have seen a 21% in cost savings. The newly installed landscaping in front of the well has started to mature, which is helping to hide the tank.

# IMPORTANT NEW INFORMATION

## Website Committee Update

After much feedback about the current state of our neighborhood website, the Davis Spring Website will be upgrading, hopefully before the end of January. We are terminating our website contract with RealManage and the website committee will be taking full ownership of the website. The new website will be more aesthetically pleasing, better organized, and will have a blog to provide more timely official updates from the board and committee chairs. Also, committee e-mail addresses will be fixed and functional.

However, since we are moving off of the RealManage website platform, residents will be asked to create a new account on the new website with their name, address, and e-mail address for verification and approval. If you need to make updates to your personal profile and contact information (i.e. if your e-mail address has changed), we will have a link to the RealManage Resident Portal where you can login and update your profile. If you have never logged into the RealManage Resident Portal before, you will need your RealManage Account # which can be found on your RealManage statement. Please contact RealManage if you need any assistance regarding this.

Also, during the migration to the new website, the committee email addresses will become functional. We will update you when the changes are complete.

#### ZONING AND DEVELOPMENT

I spoke with the Avery Ranch Developer and checked out the Neenah extension through Pearson Ranch. The first coat of asphalt is down on Neenah from Pearson Ranch Blvd to our neighborhood. The road fill has been spread over the Neenah extension from Pearson Ranch Blvd to the Neenah extension in Brushy Creek. They should be putting the curbing on that section soon. This could be done in about 30 days. They will then put the first coat of asphalt over this section and put the last asphalt coat over the section from Pearson Ranch Blvd to Davis Spring. This can take as little as 30 days. They then have to finish the sidewalks and landscape the roadway. It will not be open until these items are accomplished, according to the Avery Ranch developer. I would guess the opening of Neenah into our neighborhood from Pearson Ranch Blvd to happen about March to April of 2016. It is hard for even the developer to make a finite estimate because of the availability of his sub-contractors. This will open traffic from Elsa England Elementary through our neighborhood also.



The widening of Neenah through our neighborhood will hopefully commence in February or March. It is expected to be finished in about eight months after commencement of work. It could take longer, but I think that once they start, the work will progress. Williamson County DOES want to get this done. They are finally acknowledging our traffic issues and they want the traffic for the schools that have been and will be constructed there to flow well. For any of you interested, the trees that are to be taken down, or possibly taken down, have been marked at the bottom on the side facing our neighborhood with orange paint. The trees on the sides of the churches are also marked on the back side. There are a lot, but some will possibly be saved. One point to note: The City of Austin gave Williamson County a pass on having to contribute to a fund to replant trees that were taken down in the Davis Spring Right of Way. There isn't much room to replant them along our greenbelt anyway, but this did happen.

The opening of Pearson Ranch Blvd to RR 620 and SH 45 is not going to happen until about January of 2017 (yes, that date is correct). It was supposed to happen sooner, but the road alignment was changed and there are issues with the England/Banks families who own the rest of Pearson Ranch and TXDOT as to reimbursement for costs of land for the alignment and a detention pond to be built. This work was supposed to be done much sooner, but these issues pushed it back.

Ok, everyone sees the time frames for the development above. This means that Neenah through our neighborhood is going to take on more traffic from the Neenah extension being opened from the Avery Ranch development and Elsa England Elementary (March or April of 2016) until Neenah is widened and finished in our neighborhood. This will probably happen from September to October of 2016. We are going to have to live with it.
